

Accident Investigation and Reporting

Introduction

Structured, systematic accident investigation can lead to the identification of root causes and facilitate the identification of control measures that will contribute to reducing the possibility of future accidents. A thorough investigation of an accident is also a positive visible demonstration of your commitment to safety.

Course Content

The course identifies the legal responsibilities under the Health and Safety at Work at 1974 and The Management of Health and Safety Regulations 1999 and also looks at the reporting responsibilities under RIDDOR.
