

Control of Substances Hazardous to Health – Assessment and Control

Introduction

The Control of Substances Hazardous to Health Regulations 2002 (COSHH) requires employers to control exposure to hazardous substances to prevent ill-health. Such substances need to be identified and 'assessed' to establish whether they present a 'risk'. Such assessments should be recorded and all risks prevented or controlled.
