

Fire Risk Assessment and Fire Marshal Duties

Introduction

The Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 requires the 'responsible person' for the premises to carry out a fire risk assessment and nominate a sufficient number of competent persons, or fire marshals, to assist in implementing the emergency procedures identified in the fire risk assessment. Fire is not only a threat to life, but to business - in fact, more than 70% of organisations affected by serious fire do not recover.

Course Content
