

Techniques for Monitoring Safety Performance

Introduction

This course considers the need to continually measure and review safety performance both re-actively, following an accident or incident, and pro-actively, (via inspections for example). Delegates will be able to apply newfound theoretical knowledge for the completion of workplace inspections and written reports outlining and prioritising hazards and suggesting suitable control measures.
